



Syphilis – all stages, United States, 2013—2022






Primary and Secondary Syphilis – by sex and sex of partners, 2013-22






Syphilis (all stages) in TN, 2013–2022





Congenital Syphilis in Tennessee, 2012-2022






Key data points about our CS cases, 2022 (n=61)

- 76% of mothers of CS cases had *some* prenatal care
 - 49% had <5 prenatal care visits</p>
- 15% of mothers who gave birth to CS babies had a negative syphilis screen in the 1st or 2nd trimester
 - not rescreened at 28-32 weeks
 - All 9 had some prenatal care
- 4 mothers who had a CS baby in 2022 had at least one CS baby in the past
- Retrospective cohort study, 2016 2020 (internal data):
 - 32% of mothers had a touchpoint in an Emergency Department in treatment window
 - Receipt of WIC services was protective



Contributors to congenital syphilis in TN

- Detection
 - Infection during pregnancy/reinfection
 - Diagnostics imperfect
 - Lack of or late prenatal care
- Treatment
 - Inadequate treatment for stage
 - Not timely
- Unreported and untreated partners




Potential congenital syphilis cases averted in 2021



What can you do?

- Detection
 - Infection during pregnancy/reinfection
 - Diagnostics imperfect
 - Lack of or late prenatal care



Screen for syphilis at multiple timepoints. Ideally: 1st, 3rd trimester and at delivery

- Treatment
 - Inadequate treatment for stage
 - Not timely



If you have Bicillin, treat.

Unreported and untreated partners



Talk to patients about their sexual health and their partners

Tennessee Syphilis History Request

Licensed health care providers can access current and historical syphilis test results and treatment information for patients who are Tennessee residents to inform the diagnosis and management of syphilis in their patients. Clinical consultation is available at the National Network of STD Clinical Prevention Training Centers clinical consult network NNPTC Online Consultation.

The Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) maintains records of **positive** syphilis test results for Tennessee residents. Clinical laboratories (<u>laboratory instructions</u>) and healthcare providers (<u>healthcare provider instructions</u>) are required by law (T.C.A. §68 Rule 1200-14-01-.02) to report all positive syphilis test results for Tennessee residents. 
Instructions:

- 1. Complete the following survey
- A Tennessee Department of Health employee will call the office/facility phone number to confirm that the individual is a current patient; once confirmed, the staff member will call the requesting provider preferred phone
- 3. Test results and treatment history will be provided verbally then securely emailed to the requesting healthcare provider
- 4. If no results are found, a secure email will be sent to the requesting healthcare provider
- 5. Institutional firewalls occasionally block receipt of emails. If you do not receive a response in the expected timeframe, please call **615-741-7500** and ask to speak with Rebecca Moore or Lavonne Cole






